As we reconnect with each other within our church walls, we continue to find ways to reach out and spread God's love in our surrounding community. This is being done through powerful concerts for the community, tutoring at Greenway Park Elementary, Beats 'n Bites in Stumptown Park and even a lemonade ministry during Matthews Alive. It has been a privilege to serve alongside you as we reach out to those in our church, our community, and our world, while continuing our MUMC Vision: "through Jesus Christ, to transform the world, one life at a time."

As Pastor Chuck recently reminded us, there is always the *Ripple Effect*, and **we should not underestimate the power of one to change the life of many.** Mother Teresa told us that "I alone cannot change the world, but I can cast a stone across the water to create many ripples."
